HIV Testing in Pregnancy

As a requirement of both the American College of Obstetrics and Gynecology (ACOG) and American Academy of Pediatrics (AAP) and per California law, HIV testing is part of the initial laboratory evaluation in all pregnant women. If you test positive for HIV infection, then we will guide you through the understanding of the results and coordinating care with an infectious disease physician to provide further evaluation and treatment. If you test negative for HIV infection, then it is recommended that you be routinely tested for HIV in the future. You certainly have the right to decline testing as well. Unless declined by you in writing below, the HIV test will be performed along with other laboratory tests in your pregnancy.
